

GUIDANCE: EXHIBITION OF STUDENT WORK ...

Provision of a focussed Exhibition of student work is a mandatory part of the Accreditation Site Visit.

This Guidance on the Exhibition of student work is designed to support Providers in ensuring a well curated exhibition to present their student work, and to support Accreditation Review Panel Members being able to navigate the exhibition.

The primary purpose of the Exhibition is for the Provider to exhibit the threshold level student work that demonstrates student achievement of the required competencies in nominated subjects / units.

This threshold level student work exhibited should be clearly mapped to the information provided in the Digital Evidence Portfolio at Part IV of the Provider Accreditation Submission.

The Exhibition may also include supplementary student work exhibited to demonstrate the breadth and depth of the program, such as grade levels higher than the threshold level work.

Any supplementary student work needs to be clearly curated so that it is distinguished from the work that demonstrates student achievement of the required competencies in nominated subjects / units.

Further guidance points are:

- Student work can be presented in either digital or hard copy / physical format. Where possible Programs are encouraged to present student work in the same form that it was submitted for assessment.
- Providers must provide guidance to the Panel on the organisation of the Exhibition. Guidance to the Panel should include documentation and physical mapping, and be supported by verbal presentation on Day 1 of the Accreditation Site Visit.
- Given one piece of student work may be mapped to multiple performance criteria, the student Exhibition should be organised in subject / units or similar themes, noting the need for clear mapping of work to each related performance criteria.
- Sample student work evidence from every subject / unit mapped to a Performance Criteria is not required – sample student work is only required where the Performance Criteria is assessed at its final level or in its most advanced form. This means that evidence of student work from every subject / unit is not required.
- The final assessed student work must be from the most recent iteration of individual subjects / units that have been delivered by the Provider within the program being assessed in the full two year teaching period prior to the conduct of the Accreditation Review Panel.
- Two samples of student work are sufficient (from any subject / unit where the Performance Criteria is assessed at its final level or in its most advanced form).
- Student work exhibited is considered by the Panel in association with related teaching materials.
